## ENTERING TONIGHT'S ACTION...

Today, the SeaWolves take on the New Britain Rock Cats in game three of a four-game set...Last night, the 'Wolves scored four runs in the bottom of the first inning and won the game 7-2. Adam Haley homered for the first time this season in the third inning of the game...Erie is look for back-to-back wins at home for the first time since sweeping the Reading Phillies May18-21...Leftie Bobby Jones will make his second start since coming off the disabled list. In his last outing, Jones went 4.2 innings allowing two runs off of five hits against the Bowie Baysox...Jones will be opposed by leftie Brian Duensing. It will be Duensing's second start of the season for the Rock Cats. In his season debut, he went 5.2 innings and got a no-decision against the Reading Phillies...The SeaWolves have received Chris Maples from Triple-A Toledo. Juan Francia has been sent to Class-A Lakeland.

## LAST TIME OUT

The SeaWolves led from wire-to-wire as they took their first win of the season against the New Britain Rock Cats 7-2.

The 'Wolves got on the board in the bottom of the first inning. Vince Blue walked with one out. With two down, Kurt Airoso also drew a walk putting two on for Don Kelly. A passed ball moved Blue to third and Airoso to second and Kelly drew the third walk of the inning to load the bases for Jackson Melian. Melian worked the count full and lined a bases clearing double down the left field line putting Erie up 3-0. Adam Haley followed with a triple down the right field line that scored Melian for a 4-0 SeaWolves advantage.

The SeaWolves would add a run with two down in the bottom of the third when Haley connected on his first home run of the season. The solo shot gave the 'Wolves a 5-0 lead.

New Britain would score their first run in the top of the seventh inning. Matt Tolbert walked to lead off the inning and reached second on a wild pitch. Tolbert got to third on a fielder's choice and scored on a fielder's choice by Steve Lomasney.

In the bottom of the seventh, Brent Clevlen led off with his second hit of the game and Airso followed with a single. On the play, Clevlen reached third and Airoso advanced to second on the throw in from center. Kelly came to the plate and on a wild pitch, Clevlen scored from third for a 6-1 Erie lead. With Airoso on third, Kelly lined a sacrifice fly to right field that scored Airoso for a 7-1 'Wolves advantage.

The Rock Cats scored an unearned run in the top of the eighth to complete the scoring for the game.

Mark Woodyard (1-0) picked up the win for the SeaWolves. He went 3.2 innings allowing one run off of five hits.

## VERSUS THE ROCK CATS

**STARTING PITCHER****#18 - RHP BOBBY JONES (2-4, 4.24 ERA)**

Bobby Jones gets the start in game three against the Rock Cats. It will be Jones second start since coming off the disabled list. In his last outing, Jones went 4.2 innings, allowing two runs off of five hits. He walked just one and struck out six and was saddled with his fourth loss of the season. Jones was primarily a starter earlier in his career. During his time with the Colorado Rockies (1997-99) Jones made 44 starts. He made a total of 47 starts in his 99 big league appearances. Jones was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 44th round of the 1991 draft.

**TOMORROW'S STARTER****#22 - LHP JON CONNOLLY (1-2, 5.40 ERA)**

John Connolly makes the start for the SeaWolves in the final game against the New Britain Rock Cats. In his last outing, Connolly went 6.1 innings, allowing seven runs (six earned) off of eight hits; he walked two and struck out two in taking his second loss of the season. Connolly has only allowed three walk in 25 innings of work for the 'Wolves. Connolly made three starts for the Lakeland Tigers this season. He was 3-0 with a 1.66 ERA. In 21.2 innings pitched, Connolly allowed five runs (four earned) off of 16 hits for Lakeland. He walked four and struck out five in those games. Connolly is the brother of the Altoona Curve's Michael Connolly.
